RESOLUTION REQUESTING AND/OR DIRECTING (IF WE HAVE THE AUTHORITY) THE ADMINISTRATION ALONG WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY AND EFFECTIVENESS OF WORKING THREE (3) PIECES OF HEAVY EQUIPMENT AN ADDITIONAL THREE (3) TWELVE (12) HOUR DAYS OR THREE (3) THIRTEEN AND ONE-HALF (13 ½) HOUR DAYS.

WHEREAS, the purpose of this request would be to exhilarate the raising of levees for proper elevation and to clean out the drainage arteries; and

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Lafourche Parish Council convened in regular session on April 14, 2009, that it does hereby request and/or direct (if we have the authority) the Administration along with the Department of Public Works to study the feasibility and effectiveness of working three (3) pieces of heavy equipment an additional three (3), twelve (12) hour days or three (3), thirteen and one-half (13 ½) hour days.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Department of Public Works and the Office of the Parish Administrator.
