

On motion by Phillip Gouaux, seconded by Rodney Doucet, the following resolution was introduced and adopted;

RESOLUTION NO. 09-416

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE LAFOURCHE PARISH HURRICANES GUSTAV/IKE RECOVERY PROPOSAL AND AUTHORIZING THE PARISH PRESIDENT TO SUBMIT THE PROPOSAL TO THE LOUISIANA RECOVERY AUTHORITY FOR FINAL APPROVAL AND AUTHORIZATION TO PROCEED IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE LAFOURCHE PARISH HURRICANES GUSTAV/IKE DISASTER RECOVERY PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the Consolidated Security, Disaster Assistance and Continuing Appropriations Act, 2009 (Pub. Law 110-329), enacted on September 30, 2008, appropriated \$6.1 billion through Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program for “necessary expenses related to disaster relief, long-term recovery and restoration of infrastructure, housing and economic revitalization in areas affected by hurricanes, floods, and other natural disasters occurring during 2008 for which the President declared a major disaster...;” and

WHEREAS, of the total monies awarded to the State of Louisiana, Lafourche Parish has been allocated a total of \$33,633,297.00 in Hurricanes Gustav/Ike CDBG-Disaster Recovery funding; and

WHEREAS, utilization of the funding requires the Lafourche Parish Government to adopt a “Recovery Proposal” that has been developed in collaboration with the citizenry of the Parish and details the project(s) needed to assist the Parish in recovering from the devastating effects of the storms of 2008; and

WHEREAS, after public hearings conducted on September 1, 2009, September 2, 2009, September 3, 2009 and on November 17, 2009, along with numerous meetings with Parish agencies and the Administrations of all municipalities in the Parish, the Parish developed its “Lafourche Parish Hurricanes Gustav/Ike Disaster Recovery Proposal” for formal submission to the Louisiana Recovery Authority; and

WHEREAS, this resolution was sponsored for Administration by Mr. Phillip Gouaux, Councilman, District 7; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended by the Administration of the Lafourche Parish Government that the Council adopt the “Lafourche Parish Hurricanes Gustav/Ike Disaster Recovery Proposal.”

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lafourche Parish Council convened in regular session on November 24, 2009, and does hereby adopt the “Lafourche Parish Hurricanes Gustav/Ike Disaster Recovery Proposal,” attached hereto as Exhibit A.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Parish President, Mrs. Charlotte A. Randolph, is hereby authorized to submit the “Proposal” to the Louisiana Recovery Authority for final approval and authorization to begin the implementation of the Lafourche Parish Hurricanes Gustav/Ike Disaster Recovery Program.

PRIMARY PROJECTS.

A. Housing

BAYOU AREA HABITAT FOR HUMANITY **\$1,100,000.00**

Lafourche Parish plans to partner with the Bayou Area Habitat for Humanity to implement an affordable homeownership program in support of its low/moderate income residents by purchasing the needed land area to facilitate the construction of new residential structures.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Acquisition of Real Property

CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Low/Moderate Income

RENTAL REHABILITATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM **\$3,000,000.00**

As part of the Affordable Rental Rehabilitation allocation of \$3,000,000.00 to the Parish, the Parish proposes to procure a non-profit agency to create and implement an affordable rental rehabilitation program in accordance with the Gustav/Ike Action Plan and applicable amendments thereto and other HUD guidelines. At a minimum, the selected agency will be required to provide a one-stop shop and turn-key process ranging from outreach services, verification of benefits, commitment of funds process, inspections, pre-closing activities, closing on commitments, tenant verification, and all reporting requirements to HUD and OCD-DRU

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Affordable Housing/Rental Rehabilitation

CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Low/Moderate Income

B. Infrastructure

CUT-OFF/POINTE AUX CHENE LEVEE **\$3,000,000.00**

The Parish is partnering with the State of Louisiana to construct improvements to the Cut Off/Pointe Aux Chene Levee system. The State has committed \$5 million to the project and is performing the engineering design of the project. The total project cost is estimated to be \$8 million, of which, the Parish will allocate \$3 million in Long Term Recovery (LTR) funding to the project.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements

CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Possible Low/Moderate Income

DUGAS CANAL PUMP STATION UPGRADE**\$6,000,000.00**

The project will replace an existing canal plug and gravity drainage structure in the Dugas Canal, which has become inoperable as a result of aging structural components, with a new plug and pump station converting the system from gravity to a force drainage system. The pump station and associated incidental work will provide additional drainage capacity for the area lying east of Bayou Lafourche between Thibodaux to the north, Raceland to the south, and Bayou Blue to the west. The area is prone to flooding caused by extensive development of the area over the past 50 years. Approximately 30,000 residents, Nicholls State University, and Thibodaux Medical Center will directly benefit from this project.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Possible Low/Moderate Income

**DES ALLEMANDS/BREAKWATER
BULKHEAD PROJECT****\$3,700,000.00**

The project involves re-establishing approximately 5000 linear feet of breakwater that was destroyed in Hurricanes Gustav and Ike. Reconstruction of the breakwater will prevent wind driven water from inundating surrounding residential areas, as well as U. S. Highway 90, a major transportation corridor in the Parish.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Possible Low/Moderate Income

RACELAND AG CENTER**\$1,120,730.00**

During Hurricane Gustav and Ike the ability to protect and properly shelter livestock and other animals "failed to function" since the Parish lacked a facility that could adequately facilitate the demands for service. Much discussion arose during the citizen participation process as to the critical need for this type of facility and was substantiated by personal accounts of residents traveling to north Louisiana to evacuate livestock from the Parish in anticipation of the storms. The Parish proposes to construct an agricultural center in the centrally located community of Raceland to facilitate this critical need in the Parish.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Urgent Need

DELTA WOODS DRAINAGE DITCH IMPROVEMENTS**\$750,000.00**

The project involves the installation of drainage culverts in the last 1800 linear feet of the Delta Woods Outfall Canal. The project will eliminate the drainage problems occurring in this area of the Town of Lockport.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Possible Low/Moderate Income

WESTSIDE DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS**\$1,300,000.00**

Portions of Lafourche Parish near Southwest Thibodaux are experiencing significant flooding most likely as a result of an inadequate storm water collection and conveyance systems. It is believed that undersized culverts, drain pipes, ditches, and canals are a major contributing factor to this problem. The periodic flooding of the area not only causes damage to homes and property but also causes infiltration of a portion of an existing sanitary sewer collection system in the area. As a result, the infiltration of the sanitary sewer collection system often causes the sewer system to back up which not only creates an odor problem but poses a serious potential health hazard to local citizens. The Lafourche Parish Government proposes to address this issue by retaining the services of a consulting firm to analyze the area and provide specific recommendations on how to prevent further flooding in the area. Once the recommendations are received, improvements to the existing drainage features can be implemented with the goal of reducing or preventing further flooding and thereby reducing or preventing the health hazards and damage to properties mentioned above.

The consulting work will include review of available drainage studies, downloading and processing available Lidar elevation data and aerial photographs. The work will also include collecting topographic field data, inventorying existing drainage features, creating a model of the drainage basin, and performing analyses and calculations necessary to evaluate the existing hydraulic characteristics of the drainage basin

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Possible Low/Moderate Income

LEBLANC DRIVE DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS/PHASE II \$305,000.00

Lafourche Parish Government has a small drainage project for LeBlanc Drive which will replace existing undersized culverts, resetting existing culverts, catch basins and sweep ditches which are not to the correct grade. LeBlanc Drive has had increased residential development over the past few years. The existing subsurface drainage system is no longer adequate for the amount of storm runoff in this area. Recently, the adjacent farmland drainage system has been reworked and has caused additional water to impact the runoff from LeBlanc Drive. These improvements will greatly increase the flow of storm water in the community and will also tie in to the 40 Arpent Canal, which was recently swept by the Lafourche Parish Government. The objective of this small drainage project is to reduce flooding in the LeBlanc Drive community. Lafourche Parish is concerned about the potential impacts of flooding in the Parish due to the population increase in the area. Many low-lying homes frequently and repeatedly flood during heavy rain events. Lafourche Parish Government has been diligent in maintaining the major drainage structures downstream of this area, namely the outfall canals and pumping stations. The purpose of this project is to reduce the flood risk of those structures that have been repeatedly damaged by flood waters along LeBlanc Drive.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Possible Low/Moderate Income

LA HIGHWAY 308 LEVEE/SEAWALL IMPROVEMENTS \$2,500,000.00
(FROM GOLDEN MEADOW TO GALLIANO)

The project is located within both the Town of Golden Meadow and adjacent unincorporated area along LA Hwy. 308 and Bayou Lafourche. It involves raising and strengthening the levee/seawall so as to reduce the potential from flooding along this major corridor in the Town and Parish. When completed, the potential for the type of flooding which occurred as a result of Hurricanes Gustav and Ike will be eliminated.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Urgent Need

LAUREL VALLEY ROAD EXTENSION/PHASE II \$4,000,000.00

The project involves the construction of Phase II of Laurel Valley Road. Currently, the Laurel Valley Road is partially hard surfaced with a significant section of the roadway being limestone surfaced. This roadway is the only connector between the primary transportation routes of LA Highways 1 and 308 in the Parish and the isolated communities of Choupic and Kraemer located along LA Hwy. 307 in the northeastern quadrant of the Parish. The Parish has received Capital Outlay funding for the construction of Phase I of the project which will allow for the reconstruction of only a portion of the roadway beginning at LA Hwy. 308. The Parish is allocating LTR funding to construct the remainder of the project (Phase II). When completed, the Laurel Valley Road will be a critical connector route in the overall roadway transportation system in the Parish. During pre-storm preparation efforts for both Hurricanes Gustav and Ike, evacuation efforts were hampered as a result of the capacity failures experienced along LA Hwy. 307 as the residents of Choupic and Kraemer attempted to evacuate. Similarly, reentry to both communities were significantly delayed as Parish workers attempted to clear the only access to both communities from the debris and fallen trees and limbs on LA Hwy. 307

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Possible Low/Moderate Income

COMPANY CANAL PUMP STATION IMPROVEMENTS \$2,500,000.00
PHASE II

The Company Canal Pump Station/Phase I project involves the relocation and capacity expansion of an adjacent pump station. Specific project activities include: (1) the removal of three (3) pumps/engines from the present location; (2) reconditioning/upgrading of these pumps and delivery to the newly relocated pump station; and (3) the installation of a fourth pump/engine to be installed at the new location of the pump station. The Lafourche Parish Government has received capital outlay funding from the State in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 to cover a portion of the cost to complete Phase I of the project. The Parish will complete the reconditioning/upgrading of the three (3) existing pumps/engines and the construction of an access road to the new pump station location (estimated at \$463,000).

Phase II of the Project for which Disaster Recovery funds are needed involves the completion of additional drainage work and the installation of a larger pump to increase the overall capacity of the

pump station. The need for Phase II of the project was discovered subsequent to the submission of the original proposal to Office of Facility Planning & Control.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Possible Low/Moderate Income

GOLDEN MEADOW MULTI-PURPOSE COMMUNITY CENTER & TOWN HALL **\$500,000.00**

The Town of Golden Meadow plans to construct a new multi-purpose community center and Town Hall. The obsolescence of the existing Town Hall hampered the capacity of town personnel and administrators to adequately provide public services during both hurricanes. Accordingly, the Town is requesting LTR funding to meet funding shortfalls identified in the final design of the structure, as well as to add hurricane shutters to the project design. Completion of the project will allow the Town to avoid the "failures" experienced during both pre- and post-disaster public services because of a lack of adequate infrastructure.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Urgent Need

TIGER DRIVE BRIDGE IMPROVEMENTS **\$3,750,000.00**

The City of Thibodaux is requesting partial funding in LTR funds to reconstruct and widen the Tiger Drive Bridge. Considered a critical vehicular crossing of Bayou Lafourche, not only in daily traffic patterns but in the evacuation of city and parish residents, the vehicular capacity of this transportation facility failed to function in the pre-storm evacuation efforts for both hurricanes. Extensive delays were reported and required city law enforcement to deploy personnel to direct traffic in order to keep traffic flows moving. The City has received a total of \$600,000.00 in state funding to undertake the engineering design of the project. Accordingly, full completion of the project is dependent on the remaining requested funding in LTR funds.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Urgent Need

GOLDEN MEADOW SEAWALL PROJECT/PHASE IV **\$1,400,000.00**

The project involves the completion of Phase IV of the Golden Meadow Seawall Project and will include the construction of approximately 500-800 linear feet of bulkhead along Bayou Lafourche to strengthen and harden the existing seawall.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Urgent Need

LAFOURCHE PARISH GOVERNMENT COMPLEX **\$1,750,000.00**

RENOVATIONS/MATHEWS FACILITY-(WAL-MART BUILDING)

Hurricane Gustav tore off most of the eastern section of the roof, which resulted in rain inundating the Lafourche Parish Barrios Center, which housed nearly all governmental functions for the Parish. In an immediate and emergency measure, the Parish Government moved its operations to the recently vacated Wal-Mart structure in Mathews, LA. The makeshift facility, while containing enough square footage to house all services and offices, lacks the internal infrastructure to properly facilitate office operations and staff. The Parish proposes to allocate LTR funding to undertake renovations to construct office space and meeting rooms required in the proper functioning of governmental operations.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements

CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Urgent Need

ACQUISITION OF E-SCHOOL SITE **\$350,000.00**

The E-School Site/Facility is located at 1709 Ridgefield Road in Thibodaux, near W.S. Lafargue Elementary School. The Lafourche Parish Government proposes to purchase the facility for offices of the Lafourche Parish Government Community Services Department. The facility will allow for a one-stop shop of most of the social services for persons of low/moderate income. It is envisioned that the following agencies/services would be located at the facility.

- Office of Community Action;
- Head Start Program;
- Outreach Center for different programs of the Office of Community Action such as LIHEAP, Weatherization, CSBG, Income Tax assistance, etc. Applications would be done in this planned outreach office;
- Temporary housing for the homeless;
- Shelter of last resort if schools are not available or for other disasters/emergencies for reasons other than hurricanes;
- Serve as a location to host Head Start and Community Action policy meetings, required trainings and other miscellaneous trainings;
- The Work Connection Office;

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements

CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Low/Moderate Income-Limited Clientele

TOWN OF LOCKPORT SEWER REHABILITATION **\$3,000,000.00**

The Town of Lockport is requesting \$3 million in LTR funding to undertake rehabilitation of its sewer collection and treatment system. During both storms, infiltration of the collection system seriously taxed the treatment system and caused sewage problems throughout the Town.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements

CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Urgent Need

TOWN OF LOCKPORT DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS **\$1,500,000.00**
(PHASE 5 & COMEAUX DRIVE)

The Town of Lockport is requesting \$1.5 million in LTR funding to undertake drainage improvements along Comeaux Drive and to complete Phase 5 of its overall drainage improvements to the area directly adjacent to Comeaux Drive.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements

CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Possible Low/Moderate Income

NORTHEAST BYPASS ROAD **\$3,000,000.00**
(LA HWY. 20 TO LAUREL VALLEY ROAD)

The project involves the construction of a connector road between LA Hwy. 20 and Laurel Valley Road to facilitate traffic flows between the communities of Choupic and Kraemer and the City of Thibodaux. When completed, the Bypass Road will be a critical connector route in the overall roadway transportation system in and around the City of Thibodaux and the northeast quadrant of the Parish. During pre-storm preparation efforts for both Hurricanes Gustav and Ike, evacuation efforts were hampered as a result of the traffic capacity failures experienced along LA Hwy. 308 as the residents attempted to evacuate. Similarly, failures occurred during evacuation efforts at the LA 308/LA 20 intersection, which facilitates traffic movement at the intersection of the two (2) primary arterials in the City of Thibodaux. The project would eliminate the traffic gridlock that occurred during the evacuation of northern Lafourche Parish.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements

CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Urgent Need

DISTRICT 1 OF 12 PUMP STATION **\$2,200,000.00**
AND DISTRICT 2 OF 12 PUMP STATION IMPROVEMENTS

The District 1 of 12 Pump Station drains approximately 1,100 acres. The existing pump station contains one (1), 24" pump, and one (1), 36" pump. These pumps are undersized to effectively drain the area. Historical flood data indicates that the area has flooded on at least three occasions for the last several years. The proposed project will involve the acquisition and installation of two (2), 48" pumps.

The District 2 of 12 Pump Station drains approximately 1,000 acres of the Parish. The existing pump station contains two (2), 36" pumps. The pumps are currently undersized to effectively drain the area. Historical flood data indicates that the area has also flooded on at least three occasions for the

last several years. The proposed project will involve the acquisition and installation of two (2), 48" pumps.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Possible Low/Moderate Income

TOWN OF GOLDEN MEADOW SEWER IMPROVEMENTS \$750,000.00

The project is located entirely within the municipal limits of the Town of Golden Meadow. The target area for the project is located within a low/moderate income concentrated neighborhood and would include new sewer construction. During both storms, the amount of rainfall caused the saturation of drain fields and resulted in significant problems in maintaining proper sewage containment and malfunctions in the individual on-site sewer systems for the residential structures within the Target Area.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Low/Moderate Income

GOLDEN MEADOW NORTH DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS \$1,000,000.00

The target area for this project is in the vicinity of the Town of Golden Meadow and includes that area from the municipal limits of Golden Meadow northward to W. 200th Street. The project will alleviate the drainage problems experienced in both hurricanes.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Urgent Need

PARR PUMP STATION AND LAROSE PUMP STATION IMPROVEMENTS \$200,000.00

The project involves the purchase and installation of two (2) larger pumps at the Parr Pump Station and the Larose Pump Station so as to eliminate the flooding which has consistently occurred over the last several years.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Urgent Need

LOCKPORT COMMUNITY & RECREATION CENTER \$2,000,000.00

The Town of Lockport is requesting \$2 million in LTR funding to construct a community and recreation center in the Town. The Center will function to house agencies that provide direct services to persons of low/moderate income. It will also function to house recreation activities for all sectors of the population, including special needs populations.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Possible Low/Moderate Income-Limited Clientele

LOCKPORT/COMPANY CANAL **\$1,255,000.00**
SOUTH BANK LEVEE LIFT

This is a continuation of previous improvements made to south bank of the Company Canal Levee by the North Lafourche Levee District. The project involves increasing the elevation and providing armoring of a section of levee along the south bank of the Company Canal Levee in Lockport. Currently, this section of the levee system is consistently subject to overtopping from storm water. The levee protects most of the Town of Lockport from flooding. During Hurricanes Gustav and Ike, parish crews were deployed to sandbag the facility to ensure against overtopping and causing significant flooding for a large area of the Town of Lockport.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Urgent Need

GULF INTRACOASTAL WATERWAY LEVEE COMPLETION **\$1,623,000.00**
(LAROSE/WEST SIDE)

Just prior to the landfall of Hurricane Ike, the North Lafourche Levee District took emergency actions to prevent flooding in this vulnerable section of the Lockport to Larose Levee System in Larose. As a result of the emergency measures taken, the flooding of a very large area of the Parish was thwarted. The project involves the construction of final segment of the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway in the Larose area on the west bank of the Canal.

CDBG ELIGIBILITY: Public Facilities and Improvements
CDBG NATIONAL OBJECTIVE: Urgent Need

LOCKPORT/COMPANY CANAL **\$855,000.00**
NORTH BANK LEVEE LIFT

This project is similar to the Lockport/Company Canal South Bank Levee Lift, but will involve the opposite (north) bank of the Company Canal in Lockport. This project will create a levee (currently non-existent) and provide armoring of a section of levee along the Company Canal in Lockport which is subject to overtopping from storm water. Currently, North Barrios Street provides the only (and very limited) protection from rising storm tides. The levee protects some of the Town of Lockport from flooding and a larger portion to the north along LA Hwy. 1.

The goal of the Program is to increase the availability of affordable owner-occupied housing needs in Lafourche Parish.

During periods of heavy rains, the entire northbound lane of traffic is inundated causing the loss of business to two (2) car dealerships, dry cleaning business, tobacco outlet, two (2) doctor offices and the Thibodaux Police Station/Thibodaux City Court facility. The proposed project is for the (1) replacement of 1,150 linear feet of existing culverts; and, (2) the construction of an overflow structure at the intersection of South Canal Boulevard and Haulsey Street. This would allow water presently not draining through Haulsey Street to be diverted into the overflow structure and drain directly into Bayou Terrebonne. This measure will provide an alternative outfall for the additional water presently flooding South Canal Boulevard.

NOTRE DAME STORM WATER**\$195,000.00****DRAINAGE COLLECTION SYSTEM**

The proposed project activities will include the installation of catch basins, tie-ins and a 36" drainage pipe to eliminate flooding during storm events. The area covered by this proposed project includes thirty-eight (38) homes, a portion of the property/apartments owned by the Thibodaux Housing Authority, one (1) church, one (1) elementary school, one (1) nursing home and one (1) fire station.

The Office reported that, during both hurricanes, the radio communications "failed to function" and necessitated makeshift efforts to convey information and calls for service. The mobile tower will allow emergency staff to communicate from any location in the Parish during times of standard communication failures.

The Sheriff's Office and Lafourche Office of Homeland Security reported a "failure to function" in the ability to adequately communicate among all responders during both hurricanes.

LPSO Criminal Operations Center, and the Lafourche Parish Detention Center. These facilities house critical criminal justice records and computer systems. Similarly, the Detention Center provides support services (meals, showers, etc.) for mutual aid providers during the pre-storm and post-disaster recovery efforts.

BREAKWATER PROJECT **\$5,000,000.00**

The Greater Lafourche Port Commission proposes to construct two (2) additional rock breakwaters along the Fourchon Beach in Fourchon, LA. There are twelve (12) existing Breakwaters currently along Fourchon Beach which are approximately 200 feet in length and built to an elevation of +5.00 NGVD.

This project consists of the creation of two (2) rock breakwaters to control erosion along Fourchon Beach in Fourchon, LA. The breakwaters will be constructed by laying geotextile fabric in the surf of the beach in approximately 5 to 6 feet of water. Limestone boulders Type A, 4 to 6 tons in size, will then be placed over the geotextile fabric. The rock breakwaters will be constructed with a crown of approximately 10 feet across and the sides will slope down on a 3 to 1 slope.

The rock breakwaters will be constructed to withstand a minimal hurricane and will serve to control the beach erosion along Fourchon Beach. The original twelve (12) breakwaters have been installed since 1994 and have served to defuse storm surge and waves and control beach erosion. They have also proved to help beach build up behind the breakwaters.

CENTER FOR ECONOMIC GROWTH & TECHNOLOGY BUSINESS INCUBATION SYSTEM **\$1,000,000.00**

The Lafourche Parish Government proposes to partner with the South Louisiana Economic Council (SLEC) to create and implement a small business incubator on the campus of Nicholls State University. The incubator will function to assist in the development of entrepreneurial companies in providing the necessary facility, business and technological infrastructure, and support services to optimize the potential for success.

The project will also involve providing assistance to companies impacted by the storms in reevaluating their business market strategy and assisting in recovery efforts so as to effect greater sustainability in future storm events. Program services will include accounting, legal, financial management, marketing, business plan development; counseling on business structure, location, management, operations and publicity; advanced business services: strategic planning, human resources, technology transfer, regulation and taxation, government contract procurement, marketing analysis; financing: loan grant application preparation, financial structuring, referral services; and entrepreneurship: business plan development, financial projection development, entrepreneurial training counseling, and micro-enterprise development guidance in obtaining applicable state and federal tax credits; coordination of resources with strategic partners in the community and state; assistance addressing workforce development issues; and disaster planning.

LONG-TERM RECOVERY SMALL BUSINESS REVOLVING LOAN AND GRANT PROGRAM **\$1,000,000.00**

NORTHWEST LITTLE LAKE MARSH CREATION AND ENHANCEMENT **\$2,000,000.00**

The marsh creation and enhancement/nourishment component of the project will involve hydraulically dredging fill material from Little Lake and depositing the material into open water areas located inland from the northwest Little Lake shoreline. Containment dikes would be constructed only as needed (estimated total length 1,600 feet) to limit the area of open water designated for marsh creation (estimated at 40 to 50 acres). Material will be allowed to overflow pond shorelines at depths up to about 6 inches over an area of 100 to 110 acres; this material will serve to enhance or nourish existing emergent marsh. Vegetative plantings will consist of one row of smooth cordgrass and one row of California bulrush along selected areas of the northwest Little Lake shoreline for an estimated total length of 8,430 feet.
